"Therefore, in all things He [Jesus] had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people" (Hebrews 2:17). Jesus was "made like us," therefore

He knows what we go through AND He is able to provide that GRACE and MERCY to help us in time of need (Hebrews 4:16). But even more, Jesus was "made like us" to give us HOPE for better things to come. The basis of that hope is that Jesus DIED for our sins on the cross so that we might have forgiveness of sins. The Will to Carry On

Douglas Maurer, 15, of Creve Coeur, Missouri, had been feeling badly for several days. His temperature was ranging between 103 and 105 degrees, and he was suffering from severe flu-like symptoms. Finally, his mother took him to the hospital in St. Louis. Douglas Maurer was diagnosed as having leukemia. The doctors told him in frank terms about his disease. They said that for the next three years, he would have to undergo chemotherapy. They didn't sugarcoat the side effects. They told Douglas he would go bald and that his body would most likely bloat. Upon learning this, he went into a deep depression.

His aunt called a floral shop to send Douglas an arrangement of flowers. She told the clerk that it was for her teenage nephew who has leukemia. When the flowers arrived at the hospital, they were beautiful. Douglas read the card from his aunt. Then he saw a second card. It said:

"Douglas – I took your order. I work at Brix florist. I had leukemia when I was 7 years old. I'm 22 years old now. Good luck! My heart goes out to you. Sincerely, Laura Bradley."

His face lit up. His whole outlook changed. It's remarkable! Douglas Maurer was in a hospital filled with millions of dollars worth of the most sophisticated medical equipment. He was being treated by expert doctors and nurses with medical training totaling in the hundreds of years. But it was a salesclerk in a flower shop, a woman making \$170 a week, who – by taking the time to care, and by being willing to go with what her heart told her to do – gave Douglas HOPE and the WILL to carry on. *

Answers for week of Jan. 15 "Window(s)"

Some people say they use "Windows" on their computers. The Bible is full of windows and we will find some of them this week.

1. Who shot an arrow through a window?

Answer: Joash, king of Israel. (See vss. 14 and 17) and said, O my father, my father, the chariot of Israel, and the horsemen thereof. {15} And Elisha said unto 3. Who was thrown to death from a window? have consumed them. {18} And he said, Take the trode her under foot.

arrows. And he took them. And he said unto the king of Israel, Smite upon the ground. And he smote thrice, and stayed. {19} And the man of God was wroth with him, and said, Thou shouldest have smitten five or six times; then hadst thou smitten Syria till thou hadst consumed it: whereas now thou shalt smite Syria but thrice."

Further study shows us that the number of time arrows were hit on the ground actually did foreshadow the three attacks on Syria. Compare 2 Kings 13:2.. "Three times did Joash smite him, and recovered the cities of Israel. "

Answer 1: Joshua's two spies

Joshua 2:1 And Joshua the son of Nun sent out of Shittim two men to spy secretly, saying, Go view the land, even

Jericho. And they went, and came into an harlot's house, named Rahab, and lodged there. . . . 15 Then she let them down by a cord through the window: for her house was upon the town wall, and she dwelt upon the wall.

Answer 2: David - 1 Samuel 19:12 So Michal let David down through a window: and he went, and fled, and escaped. Answer 3: Paul- 2 Corinthians 11: 32 In Damascus the governor under Aretas the king kept the city of the damascenes with a garrison, desirous to apprehend me: 33 And through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and escaped his hands.

Who fell from a window to death but later lived? **Answer: Eutychus.** (Acts 20:5-12) "These going before tarried for us at Troas. {6} And we sailed away from Philippi after the days of unleavened bread, and 6. Who climbs through windows? came unto them to Troas in five days; where we abode seven days. {7} And upon the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul preached unto them, ready to depart on the morrow; and continued his speech until midnight. {8} And there were many lights in the upper chamber, where they were gathered together. {9} And there sat in a window a certain young man named Eutychus, being fallen into a deep sleep: and as Paul was long preaching, he sunk down with sleep, and fell down from the third loft, and was taken up **dead.** {10} And Paul went down, and fell on him, and embracing him said, Trouble not yourselves; for his life is in him. {11} When he therefore was come up again, and had broken bread, and eaten, and talked a long while, even till break of day, so he departed. {12} And they brought the young man alive, and were not a little comforted."

5. What birds sang in windows? Answer: Cormorant and bittern.

These are translated differently in various translations, but for uniformity we will post the KJV as our official answer. It seems that these birds would inhabit a deserted, destroyed city, Nineveh, singing in the windows of deserted buildings.

(Some translations show pelican, screech owl, desert owl, etc. The idea is still the same, the birds have invaded the place.)

CORMORANT - A bird forbidden as food - Le 11:17: De 14:17; Isa 34:11; Zep 2:14

BITTERN - A species of heron - Isa 14:23; 34:11; Zep 2:14

(Zep 2:13-15 KJV) And he will stretch out his hand against the north, and destroy Assyria; and will make Nineveh a desolation, and dry like a wilderness. {14} And flocks shall lie down in the midst of her, all the beasts of the nations: both the cormorant and the bittern shall lodge in the upper lintels of it; their voice shall sing in the windows; desolation shall be in the thresholds: for he shall uncover the cedar work. {15} This is the rejoicing city that dwelt carelessly, that said in her heart, I am, and there is none beside

me: how is she become a desolation, a place for beasts to lie down in! every one that passeth by her shall hiss, and wag

Answer # 1: Who -- Thieves, What -- locusts

This passage describes an invasion of locusts, invading like an army.

Joel 2:1 Blow ye the trumpet in Zion, and sound an alarm in my holy mountain: let all the inhabitants of the land tremble: for the day of the LORD cometh, for it is nigh at hand; 2 A day of darkness and of gloominess, a day of clouds and of thick darkness, as the morning spread upon the mountains: a great people and a strong; there hath not been ever the like, neither shall be any more after it, even to the years of many generations. 3 A fire devoureth before them; and behind them a flame burneth: the land is as the garden of Eden before them, and behind them a desolate wilderness; yea, and nothing shall escape them. 4 The appearance of them is as the appearance of horses; and as horsemen, so shall they run. 5 Like the noise of chariots on the tops of mountains shall they leap, like the noise of a flame of fire that devoureth the stubble, as a strong people set in battle array. 6 Before their face the people shall be much pained: all faces shall gather blackness. 7 They shall run like mighty men; they shall climb the wall like men of war; and they shall march every one on his ways, and they shall not break their ranks: 8 Neither shall one thrust another; they shall walk every one in his path: and when they fall upon the sword, they shall not be wounded. 9 They shall run to and fro in the city; they shall run upon the wall, they shall climb up upon the houses; they shall enter in at the windows like a thief.

Another answer, not based on KJV. **Death**.. Jeremiah 9:20 (NIV) Now, O women, hear the word of the Lord; open your ears to the words of his mouth. Teach your daughters how to wail; teach one another a lament. 21 Death has climbed in through our windows and has entered our fortresses;

7. Who observed romance from a window? **Answer: Abimelech king of the Philistines**

Genesis 26:8 And it came to pass, when he had been there a long time, that Abimelech king of the Philistines looked out at a window, and saw, and, behold, Isaac was sporting with Rebekah his wife.
