One would be hard pressed to think of any sin that has not at one time or another been committed, because there was monetary gain in it for the sinner. Murder has been done for hire, people have lied for money. People have been slandered for money, and all kinds of sexual immorality have been committed

for money: on and on the list goes.

Paul goes on to write about the love of money that while some reached for it they were led astray from the
