Doomsday Dud

California radio preacher Harold Camping's bizarre prediction that he and millions of others of like faith would be "raptured" at 6 PM local time on May 21, 2011, has turned out to be a false prophecy, just like a similar one he made in 1994. Camping alleged that a math error led to his blunder 17 years ago.

Camping certainly is not alone in making failed prophecies of the end. The Watchtower Society ("Jehovah's Witnesses") has predicted "the end of the present order of things" time and time again, most recently in 1975. After losing millions of disillusioned members, the Witnesses stopped giving exact dates for "the end," though they still insist that it is just around the corner (as they have since the days of Charles Taze Russell over 100 years ago). Likewise William Miller (Seventh Day Adventist) calculated that the end would come in 1843. Like Camping now, Miller then claimed a math error led to his prophetic fizzle, so he revised his chart to 1844. That prediction flopped as well, as should be obvious in view of the fact that the world is still turning!

Then, as now, "true believers" were assured that God was testing their faith when the predictions didn't come to pass. However, let this fact be emphasized: The true and living God has NEVER ONCE asked His people to believe a lie. Never, ever, ever, has He told His people He would do something, failed to deliver, and then told them that the false prophecy was to test their faith.

Quite to the contrary, God told His people clear back at the time of Moses not to pay attention to false prophets. Hear the word of the Lord: "But the prophet who presumes to speak a word in My name, which I have not commanded him to speak . . . that prophet shall die. And if you say in your heart, 'How shall we know the word which the Lord has not spoken?' -- when a prophet speaks in the name of the Lord, if the thing does not happen or come to pass, that is the thing which the Lord has not spoken; the prophet has spoken it presumptuously; you shall not be afraid of him" (Deuteronomy 18:20-22).

Harold Camping and other false prophets who preceded him should be glad that the Law of Moses is no longer in effect. If it were, they would be subject to capital punishment. As it is, we pity the poor souls who let themselves be duped into emptying their bank accounts and making other irreversible decisions due to their sincere, but misguided, belief that May 21 would mark the end. We seriously doubt that Harold Camping will be using any of his multiplied millions of dollars in assets to help his gullible victims rebuild their lives.

Let there be no doubt: Jesus said that He will return to judge the world and take the redeemed to their eternal home (Matthew 25; John 14). But He Himself said that no one but God the Father knows the day or the hour (Matthew 24:36). Since Jesus Himself didn't know, how likely is it that one of us will figure it out?
