## TEACH LIKE JESUS

Jesus always stayed on His mission. As teachers, it's easy to get side-tracked doing things that aren't as important as our true mission as teachers. Our real job is to partner with God and His Word to bring about life change in our students.

Some teachers quietly resign themselves to be babysitters. Their goal is simply to keep peace while the parents are busy in their own classes. They assign mindless busywork to the students or stuff their mouths with Goldfish and Cheerios. Somewhere along the line, they lost sight of their true classroom mission.

Other teachers are happy to stir up a mindless discussion that effectively kills the limited class time together. Lots of involvement, but very little movement toward Jesus.

Still other teachers just want to be "buddies" with their students. Talk about ball games, boy friends, and vacations may be important, but it's not the mission of a teacher.

When Jesus began His ministry, people flocked to Him for healing. Once, when He went off to a quiet place to pray, His disciples found Him and encouraged Him to get back to the adoring crowds. His reply must have startled them. "Let us go somewhere else - to the nearby villages so I can preach there also. That is why I have come" (Mark 1:38). Jesus understood that the focus of His ministry was to be in sharing the Good News of the kingdom. As the body of Christ in the world today, our job is to share in the mission of Jesus. Teachers must stay on mission and share the Good News that Jesus died to take away our sins. That's how we teach like Jesus.

# Another Teaching Tip

Larger congregations have the luxury of keeping their children's classes closely graded (a class for first graders, another class for second graders, etc.), but smaller churches often have to group 3 or even 4 age levels into one class. While this does present some challenges for the teacher, there are also some distinct advantages to these broader age groupings.

#### Advantages of a Multi-Age Classroom:

\* Peer tutoring. Allowing kids who have "got it" to help those who need a little coaching.

\* Older kids become the teacher's helpers...and we always need help!

\* Older kids practice patience.

\* Younger kids have someone to look up to.

\* Younger kids love the attention the older ones give them.

\* Older kids often feel "grown up" because of the responsibilities they're given.

\* Grouping works wonderfully.

\* Caring instincts develop.

\* All kids are more willing to try things that look "too hard" or seem "too silly."
