More Wax Questions

Remember: wax is sometimes used as a verb, referring to growth. At other times it refers to a substance.

1. Who waxed feeble?

Answer : she that hath many children (In Hannah's prayer. . .)

1 Samuel 2:5 They that were full have hired out themselves for bread; and they that were hungry ceased: so that the barren hath born

seven; and **she that hath many children is waxed feeble.**

Compare also Jeremiah 6:24; 49:24; 50:43

2. Who waxed wanton?

Answer: Young widows

1 Timothy 5:11 But the **younger widows** refuse: for when they have **begun to wax wanton against Christ**, they will marry;

3. Who waxed worse and worse?

Answer: Evil, seducers.

2 Timothy 3:13 But **evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse**, deceiving, and being deceived.

4. Who waxes lean?

Answer: Jacob (would fall on hard times) -
- (Isaiah 17:4)

Isaiah 17: 1 The burden of Damascus. Behold, Damascus is taken away from being a city, and it shall be a ruinous heap. 2 The cities of Aroer are forsaken: they shall be for flocks, which shall lie down, and none shall make them afraid. 3 The fortress also shall cease from Ephraim, and the kingdom from Damascus, and the remnant of Syria: they shall be as the glory of the children of Israel, saith the LORD of hosts. 4 And in that day it shall come to pass, that the glory of **Jacob** shall be made thin, and the **fatness of his flesh shall wax lean.**

5. What will melt like wax?

1. The heart in the person in Psalm 22 (refers to Christ) -

Psalm 22:14-I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint: **my heart is like wax; it is melted** in the midst of my bowels.

2. Wicked before the presence of God

Psalm 68:2 - As smoke is driven away, so drive them away: **as wax melteth** before the

fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.

3. The hills at the presence of the Lord

Psalm 97:5 The hills melted like wax at the presence of the LORD, at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.

Micah 1:4 And the mountains shall be molten under him, and the valleys shall be cleft, as wax before the fire, and as the waters that are poured down a steep place.

6. What kind of "redeeming" is related to "waxing"?

Answer: For one who is waxen poor, the family can redeem his goods.

A. Redeeming property for a relative who has waxed (grown) poor and had to "sell" his property. In my understanding, under the law of Moses there was not to be an absolute sale of family property.

Leviticus 25: 24 And in all the land of your possession ye shall grant a redemption for the land. 25 **If thy brother be waxen poor, and hath sold away some of his possession, and if any of his kin come to redeem it, then shall he redeem that which his brother sold.** 26 And if the man have none to redeem it, and himself be able to redeem it 27 Then let him count the years of the sale thereof, and restore the overplus unto the man to whom he sold it; that he may return unto his possession.

B. The redeemer of Abraham stated that the house of Jacob would not be ashamed or pale of face.

Isaiah 29:22 Therefore thus saith the LORD, who redeemed Abraham, concerning the house of Jacob, **Jacob** shall not now be ashamed, **neither shall his face now wax pale.**

One respondent observed:

"Looks to me like this means that we should be looking out for our brothers (and sisters) instead of just paying lip service. It is easy to say "call me if you need anything". It is right to go and see what is needed and do it without them having to ask."

7. What waxed sore?

Answer: Famine in Egypt.

Genesis 41:56 And the famine was over all the face of the earth: and Joseph opened all the storehouses, and sold unto the Egyptians; and **the famine waxed sore** in the land of Egypt.

The workers at the tower of Babel were confident that they were going to build a tower that reached to Heaven (Genesis 11). How assured they were of their goal and cheerful that they were going to make a name for themselves.

Did the folks in Jericho laugh as the Israelites marched around their fortified city (Joshua 6)? The city dwellers thought they were safe and secure while the marchers wasted their time. Those walls were sturdy. They would never fall.

Those at Calvary were convinced that the deceiver would not return. They even went as far as to secure the tomb lest his disciples steal his body and start a rumor (Matthew 27:63). They were sure that this would be the end of the one called Christ.
