Weed or Flower?

Dandelions are deep-rooted weeds that put out a small yellow flower that turns into a puffball full of seeds. When the wind blows, the seeds are scattered, thus potentially planting more dandelions in many more places. To many, they are a nuisance, a weed.

However, Ray Hawk discovered that there are some in the world who look at dandelions differently: *In June of 1992 a group of us went into Russia for the first time after they became an open society. We landed in Moscow and then flew to Syktyvkar, 1,000 miles to the north. When we arrived, I was surprised to find dandelions growing everywhere. I asked*

*my translator why they didn't cut them when they mowed the grass. Her reply was, "We don't cut them because they are beautiful flowers." My first thought was, "Dandelions have a flower, but... they are a weed!"*

Hawk also points out that PEOPLE can be viewed similarly...

A man found himself staring at a person who was using foul language. The individual realized he was being stared at, turned and with anger shouted, "What are you looking at?"
